Happy New Year Coal Creek! We hope you all had a wonderful break with family and friends, energizing those batteries and doing what you matters most to you. Very thankful for a great first half of the school year and looking forward to having an even better 2020:)

Teachers and some staff started off the new year in professional development on site Monday here at CCE. We were fortunate to have Michelle Qazi, Director of Reading for the Boulder Valley School District, for a presentation on dyslexia and how to best support our students. We then spent the second half of PD with the tremendous team from BVKID and with President Michael Bucey working with our staff during the "Experience Dyslexia" simulation. The simulation is best explained from BVKID as follows:

Experience Dyslexia® is a simulation that lets participants experience some of the challenges and frustrations faced by people with language-based learning differences. Participants are guided through six learning tasks commonly encountered in the classroom or workplace. These activities are followed by a group discussion focusing on experiences shared and lessons learned, as well as practical tips, accommodations and interventions for the classroom.

'Tis the season for Parent Teacher Conference opportunities. All families will get an email with a hyperlink from "Help at School" on Monday, January 13th to sign up for a time to meet your child's teacher. February conference dates are scheduled for Feb 4th and 6th.

We are all very excited to begin the Trip Tracker Program again at Coal Creek Elementary! Dr. Peter Hurst from the BVSD Transportation Department along with Suzy Tegen and PTA have been instrumental in bringing this program back to our community! Below is an excerpt from Dr. Hurst which explains the program and has a link for registration if you haven't signed up already.

Would you like your children to be rewarded for walking, biking, carpooling or bus riding to school? BVSD Trip Tracker is a program of the BVSD Transportation Department. We reimburse participating businesses and non-profits for all trip tracker dollars spent at a rate of 50 cents on the dollar. The program is supported by PTA paid program fees, annual fundraising and the Trip Tracker Auction.

Beginning January 7th your children will be able to earn Trip Tracker dollars that they can spend at <u>participating local businesses</u> just like cash. They can also donate their Trip Tracker dollars to participating non-profits! Students earn these rewards by walking, biking, carpooling (multi-family), school bus riding and RTD riding. They can even earn Trip Tracker dollars when you drive them to school if you park at least two blocks away and walk them in.

The point of all this is to reduce single family car traffic and associated air pollution in front of school and encourage as much active transportation (walking and biking) as possible.

All you have to do for your children to participate is click on this <u>REGISTRATION LINK</u> and register them. Then you keep track of their trips (here's an optional <u>Trip Tracker Calendar</u> that you can print and keep handy for your kids to record their trips) and report their trip totals on the monthly survey that will be emailed to you on the last school day of each month (first one is January 31).

I'm also excited to share a wonderful opportunity that we are bringing to Coal Creek on Wednesday, January 22nd at 6 pm and is led by Simone Marean, Co-Founder and CEO of Girls Leadership. This program and presentation is titled, Raising Resilient Girls. It is designed to give K-8th grade parents concrete tools to raise confident, courageous, & resilient girls. Special thanks to Molly Trappe and PTA for bringing this opportunity to CCE for our parent community throughout Louisville. It is an hour long lecture followed by a 30 minute Q&A. PTA is covering the costs for this program and is completely free for those attending. Fliers are included in this newsletter, along with being sent home with female students in Grades 2 - 5 for upcoming classes that will be available for girls and a grown up.

In closing, it has been asked by one of our families that I share that we do have an immune compromised 2nd grader (along with several other students) at Coal Creek and these students have weakened immune systems that prevents them from optimally fighting infections. Please remember that if your child is not feeling well, running a fever and is sick, to please keep your child at home until they are feeling better and no longer contagious.

Counselor Corner

Hello and Happy New Year Coal Creek Families!

While I hope you had a wonderful break and holiday season with your students, selfishly I'm glad they're back! It has been great to see their smiles, hear their laughter, and listen to their stories of the break. I'm excited to share some of the things that Counseling will be doing in the next semester.

There has been quite a dive into emotional regulation within Coal Creek. The Zones of Regulation, a detailed curriculum built for elementary schools, has been discussed within multiple classrooms, primarily in 1st and 2nd grade. Please ask your child about the Zones, which are blue, green, yellow and red, what they mean, and how your student/classroom may be using them. We've only begun to scratch the surface, really identifying how our zones and behaviors affect others, what feelings belong in which zone, and appropriate times to be in each zone. For example, a good time to be in the blue zone is when my dog ran away, I was sad, and when I'm sad it can make others sad or concerned about me.

The next step that Zones of Regulation will dive into is what do students do when they are in a zone they don't want to be in or that may not be appropriate, for example, yelling and screaming during class time when the teacher is talking. Creating a "toolbelt" of multiple skills is essential for children to have. This way they are prepared for many different things. This makes for great discussion at dinner or in a car ride home. Ask your child "what would you do if 'insert item here' happened? How would you calm down or regulate?"

Also, students had an assembly today that will be talked about our Habit of Mind skill "Managing Impulsivity." This is a large topic, but so important for us to learn about and practice, as well as our children. Students will have watched skits, done by teachers, and gotten to work with them to correct the skits so that teachers are managing their impulses. From cutting in line, skipping through hallways, blurting out answers, and so much more, conversations at home around skills to manage impulses can lead to enhanced relationships with friends, teachers, and others as they continue to progress into being adults.

Again, I hope you had a wonderful break. I'm so honored to be a part of this community and privileged to be working with your children. Please reach out with any questions. Here's to a wonderful 2020!


